

Packing Tips

What Does OneLife Provide?

This is the question facing every student. A limited amount of space, shared with a roommate, requires some planning and preparation when packing. We provide a desk, chair, dresser, twin size mattress, twin size bed, and a "closet-space" (3-drawer dresser, small desk with 3 drawers and a bookshelf, and approximately 45in. of closet rod space with a corresponding shelf). These items are your "personal space" and will fill up quickly. Keep in mind that just because you can fit a lot of stuff in your minivan does not mean that it will all fit in your room! In starting off with our OneLife values, consider being a blessing not a burden. Does bringing that large stuffed teddy bear benefit your roommate? Or is it going to detract from space that they need?

Packing for the Seasons

A good rule to follow is to only bring the clothes that are appropriate for the season. Fall semester will start off hot, but it will get cooler. This site will give you a rough idea of what to expect. You can take items home at breaks and bring back anything you will need for the changing seasons.

- Backpacking backpack (at least 60L)
 - Be cautious of "discount brand" backpacks – The potential suffering involved with using a bad pack is not worth it!
 - Osprey, Gregory, Kelty, Arcteryx, REI, and High Sierra are all great brands
- Sleeping pad
 - If you want to buy your own, this one (Klymit Static V) and ones like it are great. We recommend it highly for size, weight, and comfort.
- □ Coffee accessories
 - Coffee is provided, but many students enjoy bringing their own fancy coffee doo-dads
- Cleaning supplies
 - These are provided by SWU, but can be helpful if you want a personal cleaning kit
